3. Submit two (2) letters of reference from individuals who are not relatives.
At least one letter of reference must be from a current or former teacher.
Letters should include specifics on the student's academic performance, how they adapt socially and their overall attitude about school and their future
4. Submit an **OFFICIAL** copy of your high school transcript from the registrar.
5. Copies **WILL NOT** be accepted if they state "Issued to the student." The transcript should identify your African American or Black heritage.
6. Submit a typed one page essay discussing your future plans and why you feel you deserve the Helen Lemme Scholarship. The essay should be 1 page. Essays should be typed using Times New Roman, 12-point font, and double spaced.
7. Submit a recent photograph along with the consent to publish.
8. Participate in a ZOOM interview.

If you submit your application via mail, you can mail your essay, transcript, and letters of reference to the address listed below.

You will receive a confirmation email once all parts of your application are received.

1. Why do you need this scholarship? How do you plan to use it?

No matter what amount of money I get, I plan to use it all for college for books that I'll be needing in classes, tuition, or other related expenses. I also plan on maybe living on campus since the college I plan on going to is about a 45 minute drive. Gas is quite expensive so maybe the money I receive from this scholarship could help with expenses of living on campus. I recently went to go check out some apartments and I plan on staying in Cedar Rapids so maybe this money could help with that as well. I just started working and I'll be doing that over there so I can have extra money for myself and with the scholarship spend it on things needed for college.

2. Share any family history or data that would be helpful in obtaining this scholarship.

When I was a freshman, I went through a lot. For example, my dad was deported and I had to go live at my mom's house. Since he was deported, my mom had to be responsible for my siblings and I, which is four of us in total. She had a very hard time, especially since her job wouldn't really assign her days so it was quite difficult. We struggled with money most of the time.

In December of 2020, I went with my step-father to help him out with shoveling snow and the money I earned I would use it towards my siblings because I really care for them and I would use some of the money for myself as well. When my parents would offer me money "just because," I would decline it because I know they need it and I don't think I would spend wisely. Later on, I saw they were struggling and I decided to work and pay for my phone bill and give them money for house bills.

This is why I feel I should earn this scholarship – my family really struggles with covering the essentials, so I know they don't have money for my college. I want to go to college to pursue the career I want to do and help them out how they helped me when I was younger. My parents came from Mexico to seek out better opportunities for our family. A reason for going to college is so that I can give them everything and I know they want me to keep going because they know I can do it and believe in me. As you can imagine, I went through depression when my dad was deported and I had to do most things on my own because he wasn't here to help me out and I just had to deal with it. I still struggle to this day but I do my best because my dad has always told me "no matter what's going on you keep moving ahead and work your ways to doing your best". My dad had a punishment for a couple years and once my brother turns 21 we are

going to start fixing his papers and I since I'm going to college to do what I want to do for my life which is be a medical assistant. All the hard work I've done my whole life is just amazing, I like to be recognized for the work I do. I was going through hard times recently and also when I was living with my mom due to the fact that my dad was deported and it's hard sometimes dealing with everything including my past. I've tried committing suicide but what stopped me was my dad, sister, brothers because I care for them and how they feel and I don't think they would be well if I really did. Another thing is my future because I want to be a Medical Assistant something that I've worked so hard for. I still have hard times and I try to deal with them like something that I've gotten was tremors where I start shaking or trembling. I also would get very bad headaches and get really dizzy but I try controlling it. My aunt had told me I get these from strong emotions and stressing. I do remember stressing with homework because I don't want any assignments missing so I try to stay caught up. Now I just hope everything goes good in college and am able to afford for college without using money from out of pocket. I am glad that people and organizations are able to provide money for us students looking forward to pursue our future career.

3. Tell us about your strengths and personal qualities that make you who you are.

Some strengths and personal qualities that make me who I am are like being responsible, helpful, and caring. I stay caught up on all my homework, I get my things done on time and turn them in. I usually never have any assignments missing so I am all set. I also enjoy helping others and making sure they're all caught up in class so they can pass. I make sure I'm passing but my classmates as well by explaining to them when they don't understand what the teacher had said or taught in the lesson given that day. Caring is another strength I make sure everyone is doing good people that I am really close to and myself as well I am doing good. It's always good to check up on people so they know you care for them and they know that they have someone to be there for me.

Two personalities I have are honesty and friendly. I am really honest and will be straightforward because honesty is a good thing because you can be trusted by others when you're honest. I would like to recommend Fatima Martinez-Zavala of West Liberty High School's Class of 2023 for your scholarship. Fatima ranks 34th in her class of 82 with a GPA of 3.16. She had particularly strong academic performance her freshman and senior years, with respective GPAs of 3.88 and 3.91. As with many other students here and elsewhere, she struggled academically during the pandemic during her sophomore and junior years. Seeing her recovery this year return to what she already knew she was capable of has been really fun to watch. Fatima is intellectually sharp, detail-oriented, resilient, and a great leader among her peers.

I have had the pleasure of being Fatima's high school counselor as well as teaching her in a dual credit course called Strategies for Academic Success. As a student, Fatima's work ethic, dependability, and attention to detail consistently impressed me. I always knew I could count on Fatima to get her work done and to do it well. What made her stand out from her peers was how she not only did the work, she seemed to understand how it applied to her life outside the classroom. In the time since the class ended, she has been a bridge for her classmates, bringing them to me for help with postsecondary planning, emotional and social struggles, and academic support. I have been able to reach more students because Fatima cared and took the initiative to connect them with their resources here at school.

As her counselor, I know that Fatima has experienced significant challenges outside of school, and yet she has not let these barriers stand in the way of her academic success. She is resourceful, resilient, and determined. I also see Fatima as a real leader, which I am not sure she would say about herself and might not be evident in her other application materials. It's not an "out front" style of leadership, but one that leads by example and draws on close relationships to bring others towards their own goals. I first noticed it in the classroom, but then I started to see evidence in her personality and in the way she contributes to the school environment. She is a good friend and classmate and I see her frequently checking in on others, helping them stay on track, and making sure they're understanding what's expected of them in school and in general. Fatima wants to be a medical assistant and she will no doubt succeed with that coursework. I see so much untapped potential in her; she can go as far in life as she chooses to pursue. I hope you will consider her for your scholarship. I have every confidence that she will be successful academically and be a kind, helpful, productive member of the community with whatever path she takes.
